#### **Home Communions**

Father Richard will take Holy Communion to people at home according to their circumstances. This is a privilege and enables for prayer in the home at difficult times and for the communicant to receive Holy Communion at home. Please never hesitate to contact me if you would like Holy Communion at home if you are unable to come to church because of sickness or being housebound.

Here are some guidelines to assist you:

1. If you can, please arrange a surface with a white cloth upon which I can place the Blessed Sacrament. If this is difficult please do not worry too much but it is appreciated.

- 2. The Priest will not enter into general conversation until after the celebration which lasts about ten minutes. Then he would appreciate a cup of tea and chat with you but if your circumstances don't allow, please do not worry.
- 3. Please consider giving a donation to the Church for the Priest's ministry. He will have had to drive to you and it also enables you to give your weekly collection to support the priestly ministry in the parish / chaplaincy. This means there can be a Priest available for you and for others with a priestly presence in the parish / chaplaincy. It is a long-established custom if you can to make an offering to the Church in thankfulness for the ministry of the Church.
- 4. You don't have to tidy up before the priest arrives! Just prepare spiritually for an encounter with Christ in the Eucharist by being prayerful before his arrival.

#### **Father Richard writes:**

Dear friends

We have recently received a legacy for 1000 euros from the estate of the late Jill Dorsett who died earlier this year. Jill was a tireless worker for and great supporter of the Chaplaincy for many, many years. She is still greatly missed especially her wonderful sense of humour and friendship which she shared with many of us. Jill's generosity to the Chaplaincy, even after death, is a sign of her dedication to the life of the Church, her faith and this Chaplaincy. A statue of S. Joseph is being given to honour her and will be placed in Lago Jardín Church in due course. Please continue to give thanks to God for Jill's life and work and pray for the repose of her soul.

Thank you for your generosity throughout November in response to the devastating floods in Valencia. We raised 720 euros which will be sent to the flood appeal via our bank.

One of the many joy of living in Spain starts to develop in December with Advent and the approach of Christmass. December 8<sup>th</sup> is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary and many churches have novenas (nine days) of prayer leading up to the Solemnity itself. The principal church in Torrevieja is dedicated to the Immaculate Conception and Our Lady, as she is honoured in the Immaculate Conception, is the *Patrona de España*. This year the Solemnity falls on the Second Sunday of Advent and this year is the one exception when the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception takes precedence over the Second Sunday. So, unusually this year, you will see white vestments being worn; the Eucharist is of the Immaculate Conception (except that the second reading is from the Second Sunday of Advent); the Gloria is sung. Normally the Gloria is omitted on the Sundays of Advent.

But it is important to set this in the context in which find ourselves. We are not in England! (Or indeed, any other country.) We work in a Spanish ecumenical setting with, principally, the Spanish Catholic Church and it is those bonds of ecumenical and fraternity charity which we have maintained over many years and continue to develop that are important. This weekend is an opportunity to express that in our liturgy. It is important and generous that we should do so.

We have two Holy Hours in Advent – on the 9<sup>th</sup> and then the 20<sup>th</sup>. Advent is a time of waiting and watching – waiting in expectation for the coming again of the Lord in majesty and glory.

It is a time of prayerful hope and I hope that we will make time to be with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar and pray, pray, pray. For it is our prayer life which makes manifest that deepest longing for the coming of Christ: a coming again we long for at the end of time; his incarnational coming among us in Bethlehem; and his coming to us in the Holy Eucharist.

May God bless you all this Advent.





Gospel

Luke 1:26-38

'I am the handmaid of the Lord'

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.' 'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary 'let what you have said be done to me.' And the angel left her.

#### Homily



Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This feast celebrates God's choice of Mary to be the mother of Jesus. God preserved Mary from the stain of original sin from the moment of her conception. Thus, Mary was the first to receive the benefit of the redemption that her Son would merit for all.

To reflect upon this mystery, the Gospel reading for today presents to us the story of the Annunciation. It is through her exchange with the angel Gabriel that Luke, the Evangelist, introduces the person of Mary. The

Annunciation begins in the context of Luke's account of the birth of John the Baptist. "In the sixth month," referring to Elizabeth's pregnancy, the angel Gabriel appears to a virgin of Nazareth—Mary. Indeed, there are many parallels in Luke's accounts of the births of John the Baptist and Jesus.

In this passage, Luke tells us much about Mary and the child she is to bear. We learn that Mary is a virgin from Nazareth who is betrothed to a man named Joseph, who was of the house of David. The angel greets Mary in the most glowing of terms, acknowledging the favour she has found with God. The son Mary is to conceive is described in messianic terms. He will be called "Son of the Most High" and the "Son of God."

Mary is bold in her exchange with the angel. She is troubled by his greeting and questions the message, asking "How am I to bear a son if I have no relations with a man?" Mary is told that she will conceive through the power of the Holy Spirit and is offered a sign in the miraculous pregnancy of her elder cousin Elizabeth.

Mary's affirmative response to this seemingly impossible message gives evidence to the grace we know that she possesses from God. Only one who is "full of grace" can be so receptive to and cooperative with the will of God. Because of this, Mary is the model of discipleship for all Christians.
