Home Communions

Father Richard will take Holy Communion to people at home according to their circumstances. This is a privilege and enables for prayer in the home at difficult times and for the communicant to receive Holy Communion at home. Please never hesitate to contact me if you would like Holy Communion at home if you are unable to come to church because of sickness or being housebound.

Here are some guidelines to assist you:

1. If you can, please arrange a surface with a white cloth upon which I can place the Blessed Sacrament. If this is difficult please do not worry too much but it is appreciated.

- 2. The Priest will not enter into general conversation until after the celebration which lasts about ten minutes. Then he would appreciate a cup of tea and chat with you but if your circumstances don't allow, please do not worry.
- 3. Please consider giving a donation to the Church for the Priest's ministry. He will have had to drive to you and it also enables you to give your weekly collection to support the priestly ministry in the parish / chaplaincy. This means there can be a Priest available for you and for others with a priestly presence in the parish / chaplaincy. It is a long-established custom if you can to make an offering to the Church in thankfulness for the ministry of the Church.
- 4. You don't have to tidy up before the priest arrives! Just prepare spiritually for an encounter with Christ in the Eucharist by being prayerful before his arrival.

Father Richard writes:

Thank you to Father Rodney Middleton for celebrating the Eucharist when I was away and to Joan Berry for leading a Liturgy of the Word in the absence of a Priest.

It is good to be back after a rewarding and refreshing holiday in Castilla y León where I visited the cities of Valladolid, Burgos, Salamanca, and Zamora. Zamora was particularly interesting with twenty-two Romanesque churches – the highest number in Europe. I think I managed to see twenty of them in three days. Now back to a busy schedule...

On Monday we have a Mass with the Laying on of Hands and Anointing on October 28th which affords us a prayerful opportunity to come to the altar for a liturgy described as follows: *Christ is always present when we gather in his name; today we welcome him as physician and healer. Through this Eucharist and anointing we invoke his healing power.* We come to the Lord and seek his healing and comforting grace for those moments and conditions of life in which we turn to the Lord for healing of mind, body, and spirit.

Our offering of the Holy Rosary on November 8th gives us an opportunity to pray to the Lord and seek the prayers of his Blessed Mother and ours. If you have never prayed the Rosary before or have always wondered what the Rosary is now you have an opportunity to learn. Please bring your prayer requests with you and they will be offered. We meditate on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary, the compendium of the gospel. Please bring your Rosary bead with you or try and obtain some if you don't have already.

Looking also into November, the Church looks beyond our pilgrim life on earth and sets her liturgical direction towards the hope that awaits us all. All Saints' Day on November 1st celebrates the triumph of Christ in the saints, the holy men and women of God in every time and place who fought for the faith and ran the race. Now crowned with eternal glory, we celebrate their victory and communion with us.

On November 2nd, we come to the altar for a Requiem Mass to commemorate and pray for the faithful departed, our loved ones who have gone before us. The obit lists will be available in both our churches from the last weekend of September and throughout October for you to write their names IN BLOCK CAPITALS PLEASE FOR CLARITY and they will be prayed for at Mass on November 2nd. Come and honour them through your prayers and presence at the Requiem Mass.

Then on the weekend of 9th/ 10th November we will have our usual Remembrance Sunday commemorations with the two minutes silence both at La Siesta and Lago Jardín.

TWO IMPORTANT MASSES FOR NOVEMBER




Friday 1st November ALL SAINTS ***1030*** HOLY EUCHARIST *Lago Jardín*

Every high priest has been taken out of mankind and is appointed to act for men in their relations with God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins; and so he can sympathise with those who are ignorant or uncertain because he too lives in the limitations of weakness. That is why he has to make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No one takes this honour on himself, but each one is called by God, as Aaron was. Nor did Christ give himself the glory of becoming high priest, but he had it from the one who said to him: *You are my son, today I have become your father,* and in another text: *You are a priest of the order of Melchizedek, and for ever.*

Gospel

Mark 10:46-52

Go; your faith has saved you

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and


went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.

Homily

Today we continue to read from Mark's Gospel. In this Gospel, we find evidence of Jesu' fame in the sizable crowd that accompanies him as he journeys to Jerusalem. Jesus' reputation as a healer has preceded him. When the blind man, Bartimaeus, hears that Jesus of Nazareth is passing by, he calls out to him, asking for his pity.

When Bartimaeus calls out to Jesus, the crowd around him tries to silence him. Yet Bartimaeus persists, calling out more loudly and with greater urgency. He will not be silenced or deterred from getting Jesus' attention. We notice how quickly the crowd's reaction changes when Jesus calls for Bartimaeus. Those who sought to quiet him now encourage him.

When Jesus restores Bartimaeus's sight, no elaborate action is required. (In other healing stories in Mark's Gospel, actions accompany Jesus' words). In this instance, Jesus simply says that Bartimaeus's faith has saved him. Throughout Mark's Gospel, the success of Jesus' healing power has often been correlated with the faith of the person requesting Jesus' help. For example, it is because of her faith that the woman with the hemorrhage is healed. When faith is absent, Jesus is unable to heal; we see this after his rejection in Nazareth. Once his sight has been restored, Bartimaeus follows Jesus on his way to Jerusalem. In Mark's Gospel, Bartimaeus is the last disciple called by Jesus before he enters Jerusalem. Bartimaeus hears that Jesus of Nazareth is passing by, but he calls out to Jesus using words of faith—"Son of David." Many in Jesus' time believed that the anticipated Jewish Messiah would be a descendent of King David. Bartimaeus's words prepare us for the final episodes of Mark's Gospel, which begin with Jesus' preparation for the Passover and his triumphant entry into Jerusalem. As Mark has shown us in our readings over the past few Sundays, however, Jesus will be the Messiah in a way that will be difficult for many to accept. Jesus will show himself to be the Messiah through his suffering and death.
